**What age and type of children do you care for?** Infant-18, both boys and girls. We take children that are in need and can function in a home atmosphere with Christian parental guidance and discipline.

### Is Alpha state funded?

No, Alpha is 100% privately funded. We are always in need of financial support. Our support comes from churches, individuals, businesses, and groups interested in helping children.

### Do you have state regulations?

Yes, we must comply with all statutory laws and regulations governing child care and non-profit organizations.

### Is Alpha non-profit?

Yes, Alpha is a non-profit incorporation governed by a seven member board of directors.

### Is there a fee?

No, only if funds are available or the family can afford to help. We do not charge a tuition fee.

### Who do you contact for a placement?

### What are your needs?

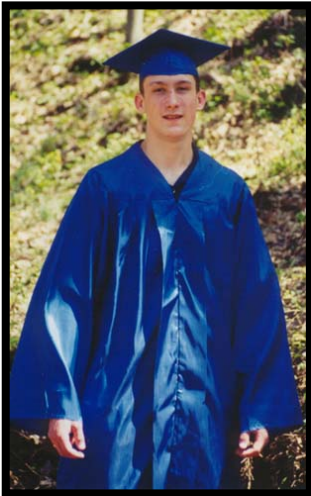


## What is Alpha?

The Alpha Christian Children’s Home was established in June 1972 to care for children in need because of Love for Jesus and all children. Every child needs to know someone cares for them. We are ready to give that love to each child coming to us. In a time of great trouble for our people and country, there are many children that need us to teach them of Christ and God’s Word, and to give them a home and love. Our Motto is “Alpha and Omega: for a child Alpha is a beginning, and when they find Jesus, there is no ending.”

Children helped by Alpha are those being raised by grandparents who are no longer able, children who have been abused, neglected, orphaned, troubled, or poor, and children from dysfunctional families.

The children are raised in a family atmosphere, with Christian parents and 12 to 16 children. Each child is given individual attention to their particular problems and needs.

Many activities are available, such as fishing, hiking, nature study, baseball, bike riding, football, skating, basketball, church related activities, school activities including state and national competition, swimming, family and community interest trips. There are also many more family activities normal on a ranch setting.

In addition to these activities and trips, there is a lot of day to day caring and teaching of honor and respect for others and encouragement of each child to endeavor according to his or her abilities, that they might become caring and responsible citizens.
