Art Pieces From The Children With Love



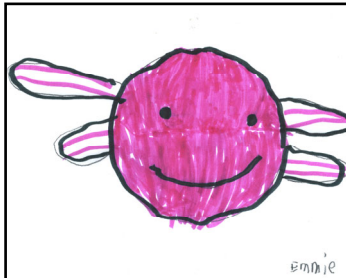
"Living The Good Life" By Mae, Age 15
Mae said, "I wanted to show a cat inside, living the good life, while the dog was outside looking in as he and his owner enjoyed the spring sunshine."



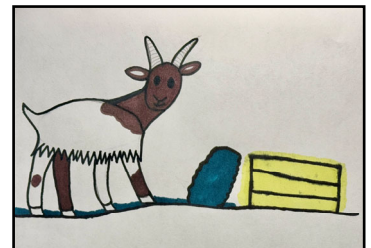
"Cowboy" By Ariaah, Age 10

Ava said, "I was trying to recreate one of my old sketches of a tree and sunset, but with acrylic paint pens this time. I tried my best on the shading."

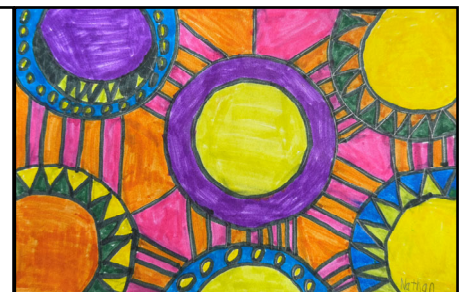


"Axolotl!" By Emmie, Age 8

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Celebrating the Kids



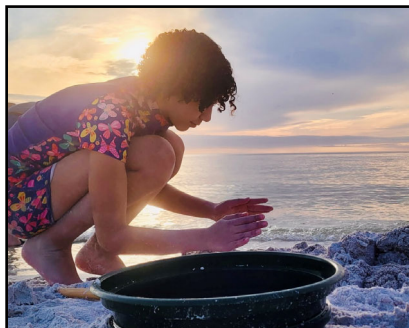

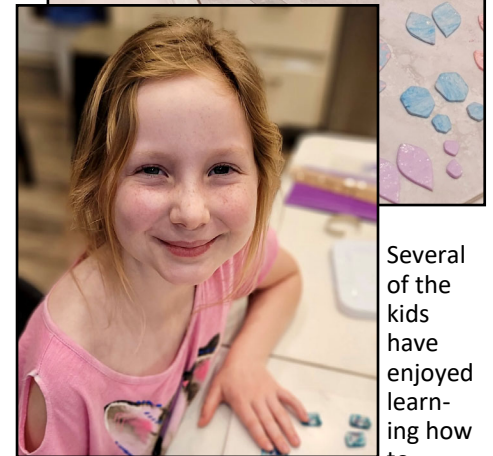
Jayden took delight in sledding and building a snowman for the first time, though adjusting to our cold weather has been a challenge for the boys!

A Black History Month activity that she planned for them had them working together as “slaves” to plot a way North utilizing the quilt codes used to communicate with the freedom seekers and station masters of the Underground Railroad, and hints given about the terrain. They could make up their own scenarios as far as what time to leave, what supplies they’d need, and

what to avoid. What a creative way to facilitate mentally placing themselves in the shoes of slaves seeking freedom, and what would be required to obtain that freedom!

This also included a really good discussion about being slaves to sin and how the examples in the Bible and of our forbearers’ trust in God can direct us to safe paths.
